THE THOMAS J. WATSON SCHOOL OF INTERNATIONAL

AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS is dedicated to creating policy-focused learning experiences and research solutions that can change systems and societies for the better.



THE ADMISSION WELCOME CENTER opens in the fall of 2025 in Brown's historic Manning Hall, serving as a launchpad for campus tours and a home base for visitors and information sessions.



THE RUTH J. SIMMONS QUAD underwent renovations to add a terraced amphitheater, seating areas and landscaping to one of the campus's main green spaces — providing a new, accessible location for outdoor classes, performances and social activities.



THE BRIDGE SCHOLARS PROGRAM, a free six-week hybrid summer leadership institute, admitted its second cohort. With a focus on first-generation college students and others with limited college exposure, the program helps students build a strong and supportive community.



THE LINDEMANN PERFORMING ARTS CENTER has had a busy second year, hosting 25 courses as well as group rehearsals, student performances, Brown University Orchestra performances and special appearances by renowned artists Jon Batiste, Daveed Diggs, Julien Creuzet, Zlatomir Fung and more.






