Using Public Transport to CIS

Upon arrival at CIS please register with our security staff at the Moongate entrance (approx. 50ft away from the CIS parking lot). The University Counselling Office is in Room 324, Level 3, located 2 floors above the glass enclosed Cafeteria. Our friendly security colleagues can also direct you to our office. Look forward to your visit!

From Kowloon Peninsula Side of Victoria Harbour

Take the MTR to Hung Hom (East Rail Line). Take the Exit D for the tunnel buses to Hong Kong Island. Take 108 tunnel bus to Braemar Hill Bus Terminus (B.H.B.T.) which is the last stop.

Using MTR

Take the MTR to Tin Hau (Chai Wan/Hong Kong Line). Exit A – Take the green mini bus N0: 49 M. Get off at the Braemar Hill Bus Terminus (B.H.B.T.)

or

Take the MTR to Causeway Bay (Chai Wan/Hong Kong Line). Exit E Paterson Street – Take the green mini bus N0: 25 to BHBT.
